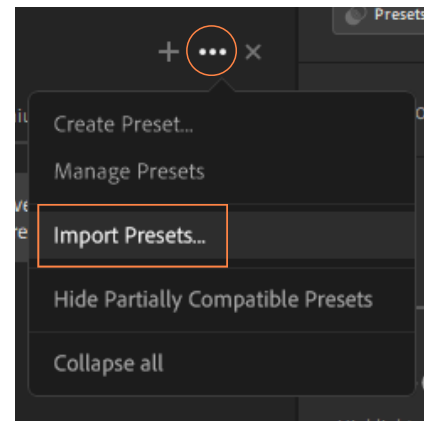
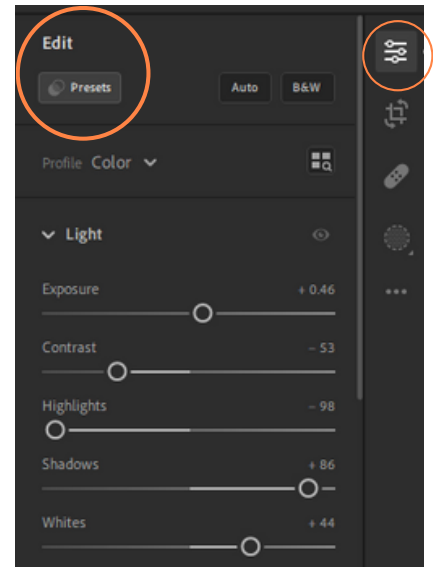

INSTALL ON DESKTOP

HOW TO INSTALL THE .XMP LIGHTROOM PRESETS

- Open **lightroom classic 7.3** or newer
- Go to your **edit panel** (top right corner)
- Click the + on your **presets** tab and hit "**import presets**"

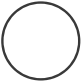
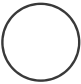
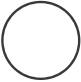
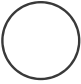
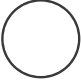
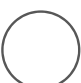



PLEASE NOTE

Lightroom Classic version 7.3 changed the presets from .lrtemplate to .xmp format. 'lrtemplate' is now obsolete. You need to update your software with a subscription plan to the latest versions of Photoshop and Lightroom Classic.

INSTALL ON MOBILE

If you have a phone, you can also access and use the presets using the free Lightroom Mobile App. Create an account with Adobe. Now install Lightroom mobile from your phone's app store.

-  Download the preset DNG files to your phone (if you are transferring from your computer to your phone you can email to yourself or upload to Google Drive / Dropbox)
-  Tap the filename and open in the **Lightroom App** (this will send the selected Preset DNG into Lightroom Mobile)
-  Select this DNG image that represents the preset you'd like to apply to a future image, and you should see that image, with the preset applied, in full screen on your device.
-  Select the editing button.
-  Select "... " in the top right corner, then click "**Copy Settings**". This will copy the Preset settings to be used on future images.
-  When you've got the settings copied, head on back to the main screen of Lightroom mobile, and locate the image you'd like to edit. Select the image to have it fill the screen.
-  With the image selected, you have to select the "... " once more, click "**Paste Settings**". This should apply the preset to your image.

From here, you can continue to edit the image (crop, rotate, modifying slider values, etc.) until you've got an image with which you are satisfied.

Please Note: You can always **save an open DNG as a preset**. In this case you don't have to copy-paste settings anymore - instead you can use the preset already saved in the Lightroom by yourself.
